Carter Work Project communications approach

In July 2017, thousands of volunteers joined Habitat for Humanity's 34th Jimmy & Rosalynn Carter Work Project in Canada to build 150 homes in celebration of Canada's 150th anniversary. Former U.S. President Jimmy Carter and former first lady Rosalynn Carter volunteered alongside future homeowners in Edmonton, Alberta, and Winnipeg, Manitoba, with additional projects taking place in communities across the country. Our communications strategy kicked off on October 2, 2016, World Habitat Day, when we announced the project.

In April 2017, on behalf of Habitat for Humanity, PSB surveyed 1,000 people in the United States and Canada, examining the perceptions, challenges to and benefits of affordable housing in both countries. The survey resulted in our first-ever Affordable Housing Survey, which underscored the urgent need for solutions to the affordable housing crisis. We released the survey ahead of the build week to raise awareness of the critical need for affordable housing.

On social media, Habitat supporters and volunteers participated in our Twitter party ahead of Carter Work

Project to discuss the Canada build. Later during the build week, supporters continued to engage with the #HabitatCWP hashtag as well as with new tools including a Facebook profile frame, Facebook Live and Instagram Stories.

Canadian and international news outlets covered the Carter Work Project, with interviews taking place with President Carter, Jonathan Reckford, Mark Rodgers, Alfred Nikolai, Sandy Hopkins, Garth Brooks, Trisha Yearwood, and HGTV Canada star Scott McGillivray, along with homeowners, volunteers and corporate sponsors.

Media partners in Edmonton and Winnipeg helped spread the message through broadcast and online promos and via social media leading up to and during the build week.

Additionally, we provided our corporate sponsors and local affiliates with customizable tools and assets to help in advancing awareness of the build week.

Build week overview

The 2017 Carter Work Project kicked off on Sunday, July 9, with an opening ceremony hosted by Habitat for Humanity Edmonton. The opening ceremony was live-streamed for participating affiliates and the public. Habitat Winnipeg hosted a viewing party for volunteers and homeowners.

The following morning, President Carter led the devotional and joined Mrs. Carter, Garth Brooks, Trisha Yearwood and Eric Paslay, along with hundreds of volunteers, in the first day of building at Carter Place. Later that day President Carter spoke at a press conference with Mrs. Carter, Jonathan Reckford, Mark Rodgers and Alfred Nikolai. The Carters' visit to Edmonton continued Tuesday and Wednesday, with President Carter making a surprise visit to the Fort Saskatchewan build site. Media interviews with President Carter occurred throughout his time in Edmonton with outlets including CTV, CityLab, Global



Edmonton, CBC Radio and The New York Times, among others. On Wednesday Edmonton volunteers and homeowners celebrated their last day with President and Mrs. Carter by taking house photos along with Garth Brooks and Trisha Yearwood.

Thursday marked President and Mrs. Carter's first day in Winnipeg, where Scott McGillivray had volunteered and participated in media interviews earlier in the week. Shortly after morning devotions led by President Carter, he became dehydrated and was taken off-site for observation and rehydration. President and Mrs. Carter returned to the build site Friday morning to attend morning devotions, later partaking in house photos with Winnipeg volunteers and homeowners. President Carter also participated in interviews with Winnipeg Sun, Shaw TV, CJOB Radio, Global News and Winnipeg Free Press. That evening, President and Mrs. Carter participated in the closing ceremony at the Canadian Museum of Human Rights in Winnipeg and announced the 2018 Jimmy & Rosalynn Carter Work Project in Mishawaka and South Bend, Indiana.




